Dear Friends,

January 12, 1969, is a date that will live in my memory. As a 10-year-old boy I learned about supporting sports teams I liked. My team growing up was the Baltimore Colts. Each week I lived or died on the outcome of their games. The boys would gather at school and we would express pride in the teams we liked. On that day in 1969, the Baltimore Colts lost to the New York Jets, as the Colts were an 18-point favorite. I cried and was so heartbroken that I could not look at any newspaper reports, TV highlights,

or the history of Super Bowl III for over 25 years. One day it changed for me and I was able to say 'let it go' and look at what really matters.

That event in my childhood was part of growing up, learning to accept things that do not go my way, my pride with the boys was wounded, and it hurt. Now I see events much differently, not being defined by the losses in my life, or being disappointed in things around me. Does it still hurt? Of course. But now I am able to have a different perspective and not hang on to the pain for so long.

January 12, 1969, is a date that began a journey to figure out how to mature when dealing with disappointment. Disappointment with people, events, sorrows, and pain. That kind of thing can never be totally avoided, but learning how to navigate through it all is what we can do better in life.

Christian Disciples in Mission Living Beyond Sunday

What is Baptism?

As our Gospel directs us, this week we reflect on the very first Sacrament we receive as Christians. There is a lot that can be said about the Sacrament of Baptism, from the prefigurations of baptism in the Old Testament to the specific graces we receive. For most of us baptized as children, we hardly ever look back and think about the significance of baptism or how it has affected our life. Unfortunately, most of us have either forgotten or never received proper catechesis on the significance of baptism.

So, what exactly is Baptism? The word baptism is taken from the Greek, baptizein, meaning to plunge or immerse. The Catechism teaches that, "Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made shares in her mission." Baptism is fundamentally a gift from God. We call it a gift because it is given to us without any merit of our own. When we are baptized we are anointed and given a candle as a reminder of Christ's continuing presence in our life. A white garment is used as a sign of our purity and new life as the person "puts on Christ."

The use of water is also important. It is a symbol of our burial into Christ's death and the life we receive in his resurrection. Through Scripture we get a better sense of why we use water and see the deeper meaning behind it. For example, Noah's ark foreshadows our salvation by Baptism as we are saved through water. Water of course carries a dual meaning of both life and death. It can be a wellspring for life but also a cause of death in the

sea. The crossing of the Red Sea by the Israelites is a perfect example of both life and death that comes from water. All the prefigurations of the Old Testament ultimately find their fulfillment in Jesus Christ. This is why the Baptism of the Lord is so important and why we celebrate it. You may be asking if baptism is intended for sinners, why was Jesus baptized to begin with? Jesus' gesture is an expression of his self-emptying. In his baptism we get a glimpse into the mystery of the Holy Trinity as the Holy Spirit descends upon Christ before the Father.

The Lord himself affirms the necessity of Baptism for salvation and gives his disciples the command to go and baptize in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. In baptism we don't just go through a symbolic ritual. As Catholics, we believe a real change occurs. Baptism seals the person with an indelible mark of his union to Christ. No sin can erase this mark. This is why Baptisms are not repeated. In baptism we receive God's sanctifying grace and are cleansed from all sins including original sin. In baptism we are conformed to Christ and incorporated into the Church, the Body of Christ. I can only scratch the surface of why Baptism is so important. But this week I encourage you to reflect upon your own baptism. Maybe give thanks to the person who baptized you and give thanks to God for the graces you received that day. I pray that you receive many more to come.



Benefits of Donating Blood!

Gratification

A single blood donation can save up to three lives.



Your Heart Will Thank You

Regularly donating blood may improve your heart health. Donating reduces the thickness of your blood, allowing it to flow more easily through your body and reach your heart faster. A study, from the American Journal of Epidemiology, found people who donated blood had an 88% lower risk of suffering a heart attack.

You May Skip the Gym

A study by the University of San Diego found that donating one pint of blood "burns" between 600 and 650 calories. Calories are burned when the body expends energy to replace red blood cells that were removed.

You Can Be Part of a Greater Community
People who frequently donate often develop
friendships with the center staff and their fellow
donors, who are all committed to helping save lives.

You May Reduce Your Cancer Risk

A study published in the Journal of the National Cancer Institute found that donating blood may reduce the amount of iron people have in their bodies. You need iron to live, but too much can increase your chances of getting cancer. Frequent blood donors had lower risks of liver, lung, colon, stomach, and throat cancer.

It's important to note that these findings don't apply to everyone. Check with your doctor about your iron levels and donating blood.


